DIRECTIONS

for voting rights and enrolment in the electoral register for the European Parliamentary elections in Denmark Sunday, 25 May 2014 for citizens of another EU member state¹⁾ with a permanent address in Denmark

1. Conditions for the right to vote

EU citizens who have a permanent address in Denmark and who by or before the election day have reached 18 years of age are entitled to vote in the European Parliamentary elections in Denmark. However, persons who under a guardianship order have been deprived of their legal capacity under section 6 (legally incapacitated) of the Guardianship Act, are disqualified from voting.

If your name and address have already been registered in the Civil Registration System (the CPR), you are considered to have a permanent address in Denmark.

2. Before you can vote in the elections you must be enrolled in the electoral register

In order for you to exercise your voting right, that is the right to cast your vote in the elections, you must be enrolled in the electoral register.

Enrolment in the electoral register for EU citizens is by application only. The reason is that EU citizens who live in a EU member state other than their home country usually can choose to vote in the elections in their home country or their country of residence. You can only vote in one place, however, and thus cannot vote both in the elections in Denmark and in another EU member state.

If you wish to vote in the elections in Denmark, you must therefore supply your answers to the questions on the front of the application form and submit your completed form to the local district council of your residential municipality.

If your name **was entered in the electoral register at the European Parliamentary elections in 2009**, however, unless you have moved either abroad or to the Faroe Islands or Greenland or according to your own wish have been struck off the electoral register in the meantime, you are not required to renew your application in order to be entered in the electoral register for the elections on Sunday, 25 May 2014. See (5) and (6) below.

3. Last day to apply

The local district office must receive your application not later than **Tuesday, 22 April 2014**.

However, if as from **Wednesday, 16 April 2014** up to and including **Tuesday, 22 April 2014**, you:

- 1) have notified the new local district office of having moved in respect of a move made not later than Tuesday, 15 April 2014; or
- 2) have moved to Denmark and notified the new local district office of your move; or
- 3) have become a citizen of another EU member state; or
- 4) if applicable, have had a guardianship order depriving you of your legal capacity under section 6 of the Guardianship Act revoked, which means you are no longer incapacitated) the local district office must receive the application not later than **Tuesday 29 April 2014**.

4. Processing the application

Your application will be processed and decided by the local district office of your residential municipality. If information in the form is incomplete, or the details do not match the records of the Central Registration System (the CPR), your local district office will notify you accordingly and ask you for additional information.

5. If your application is approved

If your application for enrolment in the electoral register is approved, you will continue to be entered in the electoral register for as long as you stay in Denmark. Therefore, you will automatically, that is without any need for further action, be entered in the electoral register for the next European Parliamentary elections unless you have migrated abroad, to the Faroe Islands or Greenland in the meantime.

6. Electoral register strike-off

You may disenrol from the electoral register at any time by requesting that the district office in your residential municipality strike you off. In order to disenrol from the electoral register for the European Parliamentary elections of 25 May 2014 you must submit a request to be struck off to the local district office not later than **Friday, 9 May 2014**.

7. Especially for Danes that change their citizenship to that of another EU member state

If you are a resident Danish person, who has become a citizen of another EU member state, you may be enrolled in the electoral register in Denmark under the above rules by submitting an application to the local district office of your residential municipality with your request not later than **Friday, 9 May 2014**.
